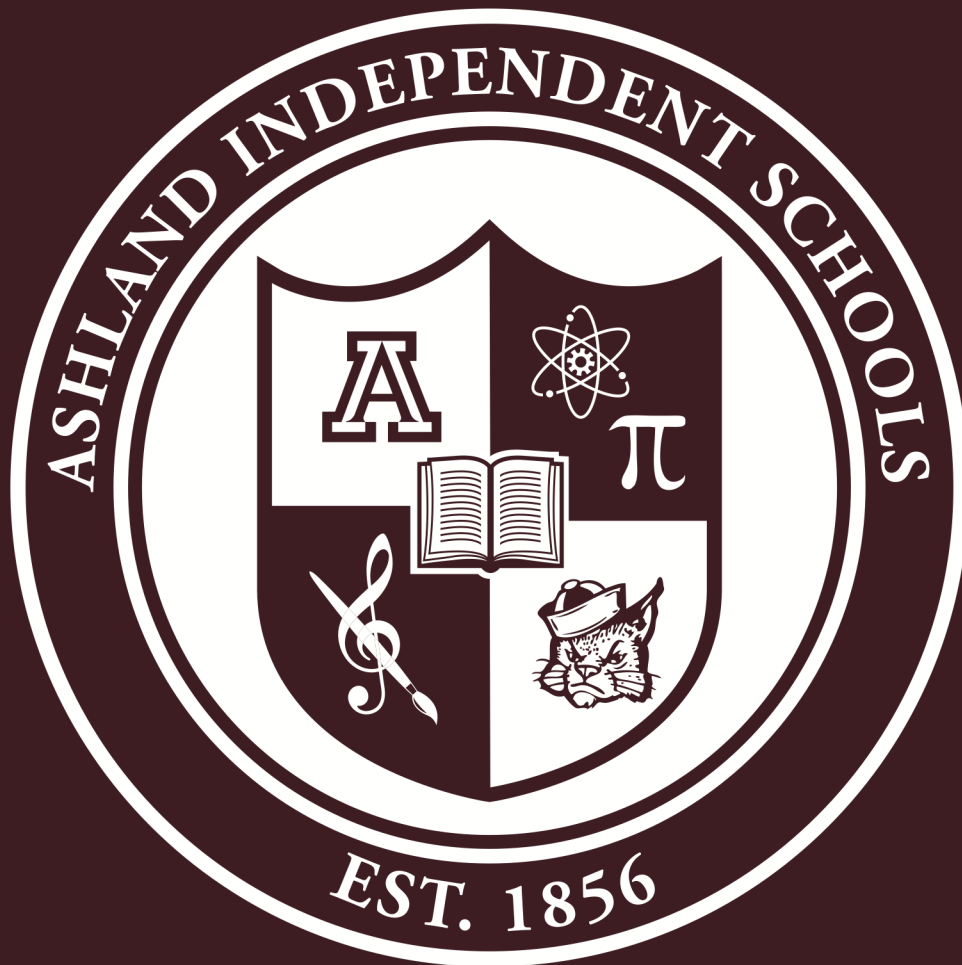

Inhale. Exhale. Relax...

CRS has started a new mindfulness program to help students recognize and manage emotions, behavior, and focus. Studies have shown a year by year rise in the number of elementary age children being diagnosed with anxiety or depression. Another study found that 82% of students felt moderate to extreme stress in the previous year. When students are afraid, anxious, or stressed, learning opportunities decrease dramatically. Teachers also benefit from incorporating mindfulness in their lives and, as a result, their classrooms. Mindfulness helps both students and teachers better understand their emotions and communicate more effectively.

Using yoga, meditation, and journaling, in both a small group and whole class setting, this mindfulness program will aid in educating the whole child by teaching skills such as self-awareness, self-regulation, and decision making. Keep calm and teach on!

It's All About Kagan

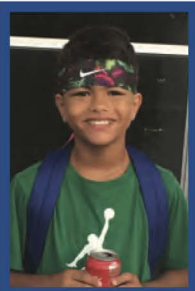
Sitting in quiet rows...boring!

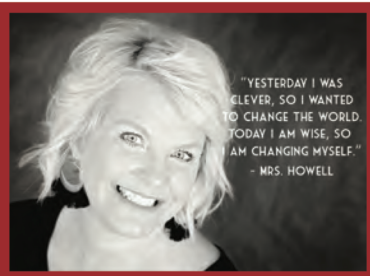
Wildcat Jungle

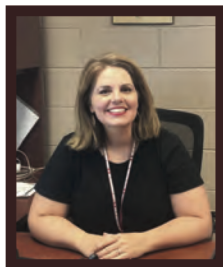

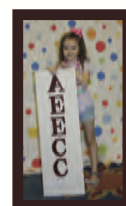
ASHLAND EARLY EXCEPTIONAL CHILDHOOD CENTER

C.A.T.S. ACADEMY



Young CATS Seen at Blazer

Creative and Academically Talented Scholars, also known as the C.A.T.S. Academy, is a pullout program for students in the Ashland Independent School system. Students are identified by achievement and cognitive test scores. The program concentrates on math and science with an emphasis on projects and experiments.

Students come to Blazer campus by bus one day a week with other students in their grade. They are met under Building One and walked across campus to the C.A.T.S. Building. It is a beautiful building with an entire wall of floor to ceiling windows.

The program offers enrichment services to challenge our students both academically and creatively. At the C.A.T.S. Academy, students are provided innovative strategies that bring content to life. The teachers serve as facilitators while students are learning and discovering. The program achieves this goal by incorporating inquiry based investigations, use of scientific technology, guest speakers, and field trips. Another part of the program is to provide students with opportunities to compete in national league competitions. Student reasoning abilities are enhanced through logic puzzles and analytical thinking activities.

We are excited to offer this unique opportunity to the gifted and high potential learners in our system and look forward to watching this year's C.A.T.S. students' progress and achievements.

Six Blazer Students selected for GSP

The Governor's Scholars Program was created in 1983 to showcase some of the Bluegrass' rising seniors. Housed at Bellarmine University, Morehead State University, and Centre College, the curriculum is comprised of Focus Areas, General Studies, and Seminar. Over 2000 applications are received yearly, with approximately 1000 chosen to attend. In order to be selected, students must be nominated by their schools, and complete an application process. Factors considered include course load and GPA, a standardized test score, extra curricular activities, history of volunteerism, and jobs held.

TwinCats selected as Rogers Scholars

This summer, Jack and Emma Latherow were selected as Rogers Scholars. The program, developed by U.S. Representative Hal Rogers (Ky 5th District), selects 55 students from 40 counties to attend a week-long camp at colleges across the state. Jack attended Lindsey Wilson, while Emma attended Morehead State. Jack's camp focused on communications, with Emma's camp focusing on space and science. Jack and Emma met with local colleges, attended cotillion-style classes, and presented to fellow Scholars. Upon completion of a 12-hour service project, both will be eligible for scholarships.
